Woodridge residents are invited to the 48th Annual Fourth of July Picnic, which will be held on July 4th from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Castaldo Park, located near the intersection of Roberts Drive and 71st Street in Woodridge. Come join in the celebration hosted by the Woodridge Special Events Committee! There will be a performance by The Music Company, free pony and train rides for the small children. The popular "Birds of Prey" exhibit will return this year along with the antique auto show. Hot dogs, brats, chips, pop, water, and ice cream treats will be available for a nominal charge. Mosquito Control Efforts & Virus Prevention

Woodridge has an aggressive mosquito abatement program that includes ongoing monitoring of standing bodies of water and conducting catch basin treatments. The program focus is on larviciding activities to kill larvae before they become adult mosquitoes – and includes applications in standing bodies of water. Mosquito-eating fish are stocked in retention ponds as well.

Additionally, adult mosquitoes are killed through the use of back-pack and truck spray applications when needed. Visit the Village's mosquito abatement webpage for more information. Mosquito Bite Prevention (United States)

Not all mosquitoes are the same. Different mosquitoes spread different viruses and bite at different times of the day.

Type of Mosquito	Viruses spread	Biting habits
Yankee mosquito, White-tailed mosquito	Chikungunya, Dengue, Zika	Primarily daytime, but can also bite at night
Culex species	West Nile	Evening to morning

Protect yourself and your family from mosquito bites

Use insect repellent
Use an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) registered insect repellent with one of the following active ingredients. When used as directed, EPA registered insect repellents are proven safe and effective, even for pregnant and breastfeeding women.

Active ingredient
Higher percentages of active ingredient provide longer protection


